Atlas Copco accepts its corporate responsibility to comply with environmental and social standards. This applies to our own business area as well as to our global supply chains.

A multi-stage due diligence process anchors our responsibility in all relevant areas. Besides our Atlas Copco Code of Conduct we are guided by the following external frameworks and specifications:

- UN Guiding Principles on Economy and Human Rights
- United Nations Charter of Human Rights
- Principles of the UN Global Compact (GC)
- Principles of the International Labor Organization
- OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises
- National Action Plan of the Federal Government and the Supply Chain Due Diligence Act derived from the same

Achieving transparency about the flow of goods and the extensive and dynamic supply chains involved is an important challenge. We face this with the help of close and continuous cooperation with our partners in the supplier network.

We encounter identified risks for our direct suppliers and, event-driven, for our indirect suppliers with preventative and remedial measures, the effectiveness of which we continually monitor.
